

Construction Look Ahead

Week of August 3, 2020

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Contractors for the Town of Fort Myers Beach and Lee County are installing new water main, sanitary sewer force main, storm drainage, and sidewalk and rebuilding roadway on Estero Boulevard from Strandview Avenue/Publix to the south end of the island.

Two travel lanes are expected to remain open the majority of the project; however, motorists may experience daytime or nighttime one-lane traffic on Estero Boulevard. Flaggers will alternate traffic frequently, but motorists should expect delays. Motorists may also experience momentary delays while crews move materials for the construction activities. Crews are expected to work Monday through Friday and some Saturdays. Construction will be year-round. *This schedule may change due to underground conditions and inclement weather.*

Segment 3 & 4 - Strandview Ave/Publix to Albatross Street

Publix to Lazy Way

- Crews are working on road rightof-way restoration.
- Motorists should expect lane closures for repair and restoration.

Lazy Way to north of Aberdeen Avenue -Southbound traffic is shifted to the center lane while crews install concrete curb and sidewalk and rebuild the roadway on the beach side.

North of Aberdeen Avenue to Flamingo Street - The center lane is closed for storm drain installation.

 Barrels separate the northbound and southbound lanes. Motorists should expect to make U-turns when accessing properties on the opposite side of the road from the

Construction in Progress

<u>Phase 4 (Estero Blvd</u> from Albatross Street to the south end of the island), <u>Phase 3 Side Streets</u> and <u>Phase 4 Side</u> <u>Streets</u>.

<u>Phase 4 – Estero Boulevard from</u> <u>Albatross Street to the south end of the</u> <u>Island</u>

Albatross Street to the south end of the island - North and south bound traffic is shifted bay side.

• Crews are connecting individual services to the new water main.

Island Pines Way - Wednesday, August 5, crews will close the south lane for the water main connection.

7100 & 7130 Driveway - Thursday, August 6, crews will close one lane of the driveway for the water main connection.

 Both above closures will have flaggers available to assist motorists and will alternate traffic travel lane. Motorists exiting side streets and driveways from north of Aberdeen Avenue to Flamingo Street must make right turns onto Estero Boulevard and then make a U-turn.

 Motorists may experience momentary delays while crews move materials for concrete installation activity.

Flamingo Street to Albatross Street – North and southbound traffic is shifted to the beach side while crews install storm drainage, conduit, concrete curb and sidewalk, and rebuild the roadway on the bay side. frequently. Motorists should expect delays.

Buccanner Drive to Estrellita Drive

- Crews are testing and preparing the water main for individual connections.
- Crews have closed the bay side sidewalk. Pedestrians are directed to the temporary pavement installed on the beach side.

Phase 3 – Side Streets

Driftwood Lane – Remaining road and right-of-way restoration will be completed after Lee County installs the storm drain outfall.

Phase 4 – Side Streets

Contractors for the Town of Fort Myers Beach are installing storm drainage on the following side streets:

- Redfish Road
- Lagoon Road
- Tarpon Road
- Buccaneer Drive
- Lenell Road

Lagoon Road, Redfish Road, & Tarpon Road - Crews are working on punch list items to finalize road right-of-way restoration.

Lenell Road

- Crews will continue to intermittently flush the new water main pipe.
- Crews are preparing the water main for individual connections.
- Crews are expected to begin the storm drain improvements after the water main connections have been completed.
